

# Ordinance Violation Criminal Process



### Deferred Disposition:

The court offers the option to “defer” or postpone the disposition (the court’s final decision) of your case and place you on “probation” for a specified period of time during which you must comply with certain terms and conditions. Terms vary depending on the type of violation. At the end of your deferral period, if you have successfully completed the terms of your deferral, your violation will be dismissed.

Defendant must agree to terms. Normally not to incur subsequent violations on the property for a specific period of time. Defendant must understand that if another violation occurs, the court will prosecute the existing offense as well as any successive infractions.

Defendant enters a plea of guilty or nolo contendere. Defendant pays minimum fine (varies) and \$66 court cost.

After the required probationary time if no further violations on the property are incurred, the court dismisses the violation.
